TRIP POLICIES

1. Reservations are on first come, first-serve basis. To assure space on a trip, payment is to be made at the time of registration.
2. A ten (10) person registration minimum is required for all trips. The trip can possibly be cancelled if the minimum is not met. All participants will be notified at least two days in advance and refunded in full.
3. Any cancellation **must** occur **prior to the registration deadline** to qualify for a refund. Also, if registration deadline has passed and/or tickets have been purchased, no refund will be given.
4. All participant refunds will be approved or denied by the Activity Center Supervisor.
5. Participants will be charged a \$5.00 processing fee if a refund for a trip is requested.
6. Participants traveling with a wheelchair or any other disability that might require special attention, **must notify staff at time of registration.** Please note: If you have a motorized scooter, it requires a minimum of 4 spots and that is the responsibility of the trip-goer to inform staff at the time of registration.
7. Drivers will not wait for latecomers. Missed paid trips will be considered a donation to the PAC.
8. All participants will be expected to sign a Hold Harmless agreement per trip, prior to boarding the shuttle bus.
9. All participants will be expected to review, sign, and follow the Trips and Tours Code of Conduct.

Nisqually National Wildlife Refuge, on the Nisqually River Delta in southern Puget Sound, was established in 1974 for the protection of migratory birds. Three thousand acres of salt and freshwater marshes, grasslands, riparian, and mixed forest habitats provide resting and nesting areas for migratory waterfowl, songbirds, raptors, and wading birds. After walking, explore the Visitor Center, which includes the nature shop, an information desk, a view of the freshwater marsh, and interpretive exhibits.

The installation located at the Seattle Art Museum includes large scale photographic murals that evoke the geographic and historical content of these rare treasures. Included in the exhibition is a 19th century shield bedazzled with rubies, diamonds, emeralds, chalcedony, agate and rock crystal. This is the first time this exhibition has come to the United States, and is becoming a local favorite.
