

SUMMARY

The City of Puyallup is issuing a bond measure to fund a new Public Safety Building. The measure will appear in the November 2021 ballot. The new building will be a modern facility and will house the Police, Jail, and Municipal Court under one roof.

NEW BUILDING FEATURES

- Increased jail capacity with dedicated mental health & medical cells.
- Space for all employees.
- Modern building replacing existing 50-year-old building.
- Safer court rooms & related facilities.
- Consolidation of PD, Jail, and Municipal Court within one facility.
- Downtown police substation at City Hall.
- More storage for evidence, equipment, and supplies.

CURRENT BUILDING PROBLEMS

- Built in 1968, the current building requires constant and extensive repairs.
- Lack of space for police officers & staff.
- The jail is overcrowded.
- Lack of parking for patrol vehicles and customers.
- The police building is not secure.
- The Municipal Court is in a separate, leased building.
- Lack of storage space for equipment and evidence.
- Police building is in a lahar zone.
- Building is not ADA compliant.
